


Discuss

A Right to Health







Think about the clean water you have at home to wash in and drink.













Think what it must be like to have to work in a factory for hours every day earning very little money.



Every child has the right to relax, play and take part in a wide range of cultural and artistic activities.










Discrimination means being treated unfairly because of religion, appearance, culture, language, ability, age and gender.

No one likes to be ignored.


No one likes to think their opinions don't matter.
